



Poster sessions are a valuable method for authors to present papers and meet with interested attendees for in-depth technical discussions. Therefore, it is important that you display your results clearly to attract people who have an interest in your work and your paper.

Preparing your Poster Presentation before the Conference

Your poster should cover the KEY POINTS of your work. The ideal poster is designed to

- (1) attract attention
- (2) provide a brief overview of your work
- (3) initiate discussion and questions.

The title of your poster should appear at the top in CAPITAL letters about 25mm (1") high.

The author(s) name(s) and affiliation(s) are put below the title.

The Poster Session at EMBC'06 will be held in Westside Ballroom South (5th floor). All poster sessions will be provided boards to host the poster, which will measure Height [4.0 ft] X Width [8.0 ft] (in meters Height [1.2m] X Width [2.4m]).

Your poster should be no larger than

Height [3.5 ft] X Width [7.0 ft] (in meters Height [1 M] x Width [2.1M])

Posters will be shown in order of Theme/Track/Session. Please look for your Theme area. Your poster should be in place on the day of presentation by 9:30AM and should be removed at the conclusion of the afternoon poster

session. Your poster will be available for viewing all day during the exhibit times and coffee breaks. Your formal time for presentation is in the afternoon.

The EMBC'06 organizers will provide you with push pins to post your material on the corkboard.

Carefully prepare your poster well in advance of the conference. There will be no time or materials available for last minute preparations at the conference. If you think you may need certain materials to repair the poster after traveling, BRING THEM WITH YOU.

Use **color** to **highlight** and make your poster more attractive, by using



pictures, diagrams, cartoons, figures, etc., rather than only text wherever possible.

The smallest text on your poster should be at least 9mm (3/8") high, and the important points should be in a larger size.

Make your poster as self-explanatory as possible. This will save you time to use for discussions and questions.
